**Jul 28 Buffalo Soldiers Heritage Trail Members'**

**Opening**- The history of the Buffalo Soldiers is one of resilience, achievement, and lasting contribution to the United States. Moab has a distinct and local connection to the Buffalo Soldiers via the 9th Cavalry. The 9th Cavalry's first expedition into Utah Territory took place in the fall of 1878, when Troop K, led by 2nd Lieutenant Ballard S. Humphrey, departed from Animas City, Colorado. They entered Utah south of Moab, traveled along the Old Spanish Trail through Spanish Valley, moved north to the southern base of the Book Cliffs, and then returned east to Fort Garland, Colorado. Notable locations included Kane Springs, a critical water source along the Old Spanish Trail, and the "Old Mormon Fort" at Elk Mountain Mission in present-day Moab. The exhibition is presented by Moab Museum and is FREE all day and will be followed by a private opening available to current members and donors of the Museum from 5:30–7:30pm. See article 10B
