This year, proceeds will be donated to Beacon, a nonprofit afterschool program that serves Grand County K-12 students. Specifically, funds from this event will go toward providing snacks for youth in the program.

What is the Soup **Bowl Fundraiser?**

The Soup Bowl Fundraiser is an event that brings together Moab locals (and visitors!) to share a meal with friends old and new. Your \$30 donation will get you



a beautifully-crafted handmade pottery bowl, with which you can fill with soup, bread and dessert during the event. Afterward, the bowl is yours to keep! A silent auction featuring pottery donated by Moab ceramicists will take place during the dinner. (We are still accepting pottery donations from local artists!)

Who organizes the event?

This annual fundraiser is put on by the Clay Artisans of Moab (CLAM), a group of ceramicists who wish to share their craft while giving back to the Moab community. Each year, CLAM chooses a local nonprofit to receive 100% of the profits from the Soup Bowl Fundraiser. Last year's event raised more than \$15,000 for Canyonlands Field Institute's summer camp programs and tuition assistance for local kids. A record 425 guests attended the event! With your support, we're hoping to break our record again!
