Harvest Festival, September 21st



The Youth Garden Project is excited to announce the Harvest Festival, a cornucopia of fun, food and celebration! As fall starts to slowly creep in, Youth Garden Project wants to share in the joy of the garden’s bounty and

harvest season with the whole community during this first time festival, taking place on the Youth Garden Project site. “Our goal is to engage the community in the seed to table process in a celebratory and educational way during the harvest season,” says Kaitlin Thomas, Executive Director, “There will be something fun for each person to participate in. Whether that’s listening to music, eating, playing, or learning something new. We’re excited to host people on our site to explore the garden”

The event runs from 3pm to 7pm on Saturday, September 21st. Throughout the afternoon there will be live music from Sand & Sunnie, Jon O Radio, and Meander Cat. Food will include Harvest Pizza from Youth Garden Project’s newly installed wood-fired cob oven and Pork Green Chile, made with garden fresh ingredients grown at the Youth Garden Project. Attendees will be able to try their hand at pressing apple cider using an authentic cider press and give it a sip. Activities cater to people of all ages, with games of corn hole, potato sack races, flower pressing, sensory scavenger hunt, and more. Youth Garden Project has partnered with the Festival of Science to bring educational stations



about agriculture as another central part of the festival and will host a mini Plant Sale featuring fall crops such as kale, broccoli, and lettuce. A silent Art Auction will also be a highlight, with local artists creating autumn and the harvest which will accent the garden during the festival.



Youth Garden Project is especially thrilled to include a county fair-style Blue Ribbon Produce Contest, an opportunity for community members far and wide to showcase their homegrown produce and celebrate the fun of growing your own. Entries are being accepted for the following produce categories: Classic, Largest, Wackiest, Anatomically Correct, and also: Flower Arrangement, Biggest Tumbleweed, and Longest Bindweed. Physical and digital entries are both being accepted. Youth Garden Project hopes to recruit many submissions from the community. Winners will be awarded their prizes and announced at the festival.

To touch on putting up the harvest, there will also be a homemade jam and pickle competition. Entries will be voted on by the people and all are welcome and encouraged to submit their homemade specialties. With the incredible fruit year that Moab has had there is no doubt that there are some delectable renditions and old family recipes being concocted.

There will be something for everyone at the Harvest Festival. Youth Garden Project is excited to invite the community to this FREE event and see folks enjoying the Garden on the autumnal equinox.
