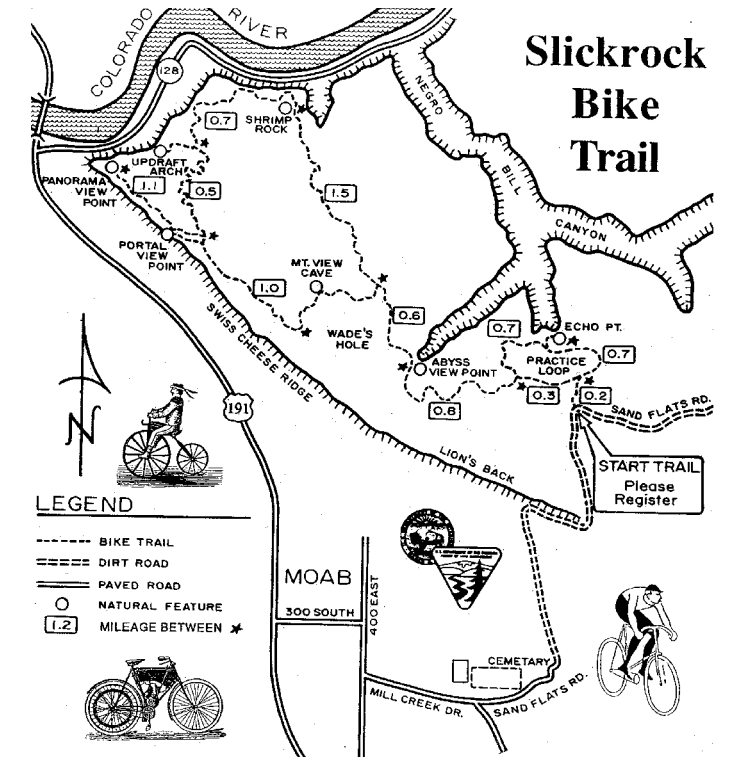
## Slickrock Bike Trail 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration

On Saturday, September 14, 2019, the Sand Flats Recreation Area will commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Slickrock Bike Trail with a full schedule of fun events that are all free and open to the public.

The Day will kick off with a pancake breakfast at 7:30am at the Slickrock parking lot. Participants can then join Grand County Active Transportation & Trails and Ride with Respect for a "Rake and Ride" trail project. There will also be a Grand County Public Library book bike. Participants are reminded to bring their own mountain bike, motorbike, hiking shoes and suitable work clothes. The morning festivities will conclude at 11:30am.

Evening events will take place at Star Hall and the nearby Sun Court from 6:30pm-9:30pm. Activities will include a premier screening of the documentary film "50 Years of Slickrock", a silent auction to benefit Grand County Motorized & Non-Motorized Trails, and a chance to meet Slickrock trail "founder" Dick Wilson. Appetizers and birthday cake will be served. Participants are encouraged to bring their vintage mountain and motor bikes to show off at the Sun Court.

The Slickrock Bike Trail was opened to the public in July of 1969. It was designed for the low-g geared trail motorcycles available at the time, such as the Honda Trail 90. Almost two decades later the trail was discovered by enthusiasts of a new kind of all-terrain bicycle called the mountain bike. The popularity of the trail helped to usher in a new tourist boom for Moab, and is now enjoyed by thousands of adventurers annually.
